Q.1 The articles lying on the table were found at the crime scene. These are suspected to have some chance prints on them. Detect and develop those, if required. In addition, find out the number of prints located on each article and mention your ROLL NO. (Leave the articles on the table)

Q.2 With reference to Case No. 08/2013 received from the Superintendent of Post, Howrah, West Bengal, you are provided with two sets of enlarged photograph. The disputed finger imprssion is marked as "Q" and the specimen finger impression of Raju Haldar S/o Hemchandra Haldar is marked as "S" compare the prints and prepare the expert opinion to be presented before the court.

Q.3 Compare the Chance Prints marked as "A" and "B" with specimen finger print slips of five suspects marked "J to N". Indicate whether the chance prints marked "A" and "B" belong to any of the five suspects clearly mentioning the identical/matching finger.

Q.4 Mark the patterns on ANY THREE fingerprint slips among the five given slips leveled as "J to N" referred to in Q.No.3 above. Also, find out the ridge counts in loop patterns and ridge tracing in valued patterns in them.

Q.5 Determine & write the Henry classification formulae of the REMAINING TWO fingerprint slips among the five given slips leveled as "J to "N" referred to in Q.No. 4 above.
